

ON THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 10, 2011 THE VERSAILLES-MIDWAY-WOODFORD COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION COMPREHENSIVE PLAN COMMITTEE HELD A WORKSESSION AT 6:00 P.M. TO DISCUSS THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE.

Chairman Traugott stated that he believed that the committee had agreed that Regional Coordination is gone and they would incorporate anything relevant from that into the rest of the document. Mrs. Perry stated that is what she heard. Mrs. Wilson stated that she has not had any feedback from anyone who has indicated that they want something from that section saved. Chairman Traugott stated that People, Jobs, and Housing was the homework assignment for this meeting. Mr. Floyd stated that he has not had the opportunity to read this section and make comments yet. He did read Woodford Resources and marked up his changes for Mrs. Wilson. Mrs. Perry stated that she has read it and reviewed the markups and she did have a few disagreements on some small things.

Mr. Floyd stated that he feels that once they consolidate all the cuts and get it all cleaned up, that they need to go over it one more time to make sure they are in agreement with them and are satisfied. Mrs. Perry stated that they would then take that version and have a public hearing. Mr. Floyd agreed. Mrs. Perry stated that they would then send them on to the legislative bodies. Chairman Traugott stated that it does not have to go to the legislative bodies. Only the Goals and Objectives had to be approved by those bodies. Mr. Wolf stated that Mr. Butler will review everything they have done before they have a public hearing as well. Mrs. Wilson stated that is correct. Chairman Traugott stated that in the last chapter there are some calculations that Mr. Butler will need to look at. Mrs. Wilson stated that since we did not have a meeting tonight and Mr. Butler did not have travel time, he spent quite a bit of time reviewing People, Jobs, and Houses. Mr. Floyd questioned if they are going to go ahead and finalize this chapter? Mrs. Perry stated that she has been through it and does have some comments. Mrs. Wilson stated that the version that is in front of them tonight is what she, Chairman Traugott, and Mr. Butler have commented on and cut out. Mrs. Perry stated that she still needs to go over that with the changes.

Chairman Traugott questioned if anyone wants to do any posturing and noted that Mr. Tom Brown is present. Chairman Traugott stated that he has read through some of the emails that went around from the Woodford Tomorrow group. Chairman Traugott stated that he is a little discouraged from what he sees as this group going around a governmental body. It is hard for anyone to be on the same page when you have a rogue group out there. Chairman Traugott stated that he has decided to not attend the meeting on Saturday morning. Mr. Brown stated that the meeting is open to the public. Mr. Brown questioned if he may quote Chairman Traugott that he considers them a "rogue group"? Chairman Traugott stated that he may quote it. Chairman Traugott stated that he feels this group is going to kick around a bunch of concepts and get a cookie cutter approach from some idealistic person in San Francisco or some other out of State place that is not appropriate for Versailles. Chairman Traugott stated that this is counter productive and is a result of someone who could not get their way and went somewhere else to try and do it. Chairman Traugott stated this may be quoted as well.

Mr. Wolf stated that the only people who have the authority to complete this process are the Planning Commission. If they want input at some meetings that is fine, but they have not come to talk to them. The real world is right here trying to get this update done.

Chairman Traugott stated that he has no problem talking to them. Mr. Brown stated that he does not think that the Woodford Coalition, if that is who he is talking about because of his involvement, is trying to steer that group. That group is a bunch of people who volunteered to participate in trying to get this community to work together. The Mayor and the Judge Executive have been attending these meetings. Mr. Brown stated that he does not think that there is anything going on there that is meant to undermine the work that is going on here. Chairman Traugott questioned the name of the report or document that they are trying to come out with? He questioned if Comprehensive Plan is in the title of that document?

Mr. Brown stated that he did not believe so. Chairman Traugott stated that the name of the document is "Comprehensive Plan for Economic Development." Chairman Traugott questioned how that is not a slap to this committee who has poured over this document for hours and hours, to be shot down by a bunch of "do gooders" at some volunteer meeting. Mr. Brown questioned why he would think that their efforts are to shoot this group down? Mr. Brown questioned why they would not invite input from another group rather than what happened in December. Chairman Traugott stated that they had a public hearing and hardly anyone showed up. Mr. Brown stated that was the meeting that he spoke and Deborah Knittel spoke as well as Harold Steele. He stated in his mind there is nothing going on at the Woodford Tomorrow meetings meant to undermine anything going on here. Chairman Traugott stated that he does not know what they think they can accomplish with a document that has no governmental authority. Chairman Traugott stated that he would hope that his Mayor and Judge Executive would stop attending those meetings. Mr. Brown stated that he would hope that this body would start attending those meetings. Mr. Parrott questioned why they should come to his table? Mr. Brown stated that it is not his table.

Mr. Floyd questioned what the goal of their document is? Mr. Brown stated that he is not aware of the document that Chairman Traugott is referring to. The activity of the group right now is trying to understand economic clusters and define this for this region and this county. To already be slamming a document that has not even begun is ludicrous. Chairman Traugott stated that it does not take a genius to see where this is going when someone with State Senate aspirations is on the committee. Mr. Brown stated that Carl Rollins has attended some of the meetings. Chairman Traugott stated that he would hope that he would not come anymore either. Mr. Brown questioned if he does not want his elected officials attending their meetings? Chairman Traugott stated that there is a process and it is right here and he does not know why they should have to go to four or five other groups meetings. Mr. Brown stated that people get to have input every month at those meetings and here it is whenever the committee decides to allow it. People have more of a feeling at their meetings that they can have input and he did not think it is necessarily true here. Chairman Traugott questioned if he would be free to speak on Saturday? Mr. Brown stated that he certainly would and anyone else here would as well. Mr. Brown stated that if Chairman Traugott wanted to call them rogue's or whatever they would listen to him politely. There have been many people who have spoken on all sides of many issues with all kinds of opinions and the result has been them growing and communicating as a group. Chairman Traugott stated that the only economic cluster he sees rhymes with "cluster duck." He said we have gone eighteen years without any commercial development on raw land. There has been a generation of people in charge for eighteen years and nothing has happened. Those people are not going to come in now and say that they have changed their minds. They will nit pick it to death just like the EDA did on that piece of land and then no one will come. They will get to halt progress while they act like they are on the side of the majority of this county.

Mr. Wolf questioned why that group is against the survey that the EDA had done? Mr. Brown stated that members of the EDA are part of their group. Mr. Wolf stated that four hundred people were surveyed and it proved what people want. Mr. Brown stated that representatives of the EDA are at the meetings and they are sharing the outcome of the survey with them so he does not understand the insinuation.

Mrs. Perry stated that this is not getting them anywhere on the Comprehensive Plan and Mr. Floyd has to leave at 7:30 p.m. Chairman Traugott agreed and stated that they will move on.

Mr. Parrott stated that he has put a lot of time in reading and trying to digest People, Jobs, and Housing. He referred to Page 102 of the existing document where it states, "The Elm Street project will include more than 100 homes of various types." Mr. Parrott questioned if that was the project that was vehemently opposed? Mrs. Perry and Chairman Traugott both agreed that was the case and that the entire paragraph should be taken out. Mr. Parrott stated that many things that are mentioned did not occur but not for lack of effort, but because they were opposed and lawsuits were more than likely involved. There were things mentioned as desirable, but were opposed.

Chairman Traugott stated that Mrs. Wilson has looked at this and marked up some things. He questioned if Mr. Butler has had the opportunity to look at this? Mrs. Wilson stated that he has.

Mr. Parrott stated that he has made some comments, but has not gone through the document and specifically marked anything up. The comments that he made to Mrs. Wilson were conceptual more than specific. If you look at the data and what was said about the data, the data was spun to fit the narrative for Preserving Town and Country. If you had taken the data and said the exact opposite it probably would have been more accurate.

Mr. Wolf questioned if the document on the table is a draft of peoples comments? Mrs. Wilson stated that it is a draft of her comments, Chairman Traugott's comments and Mr. Butler's comments. It chopped or adjusted things. Very few of the tables have been adjusted because she has not been able to get the information yet. None of the census tables have been touched. Mr. Wolf questioned if she had said that someone in Louisville might be able to help? Mrs. Wilson stated that one of the things that were interesting when she was downloading data to update some of the tables is that a gentleman named Michael Price at the University of Louisville's State Data Center did most of the tables in the current Comprehensive Plan. He provided the statistical part of it. Mrs. Wilson stated that she mentioned to Mr. Wolf, that once we get this boiled down and decide which ones they want to keep or add, perhaps she could call him and see what he would charge to update the information because he probably will have the Census Data.

Mr. Floyd stated that everyone has had the opportunity to look at and comment on this section except for him and he would be willing to forego his comments on this first pass at it. He felt that would keep the process moving.

Chairman Traugott questioned if Mrs. Perry has some concerns? Mrs. Perry stated that she needs to look at what Mrs. Wilson has done as far as what her concerns were. There were some things that Chairman Traugott and Mr. Butler conflicted on and she said she agrees more with Mr. Butler. Mrs. Perry stated that she needs to look at it further before she can make specific comments.

Chairman Traugott questioned what specifically he and Mr. Butler conflicted on? Mrs. Wilson stated that Mr. Butler felt that Figure 26 on Page 43 which is the annual rates of population growth in Woodford County in a graph form needs to remain in the document and be updated. Mrs. Perry stated that she agrees with that as well. Chairman Traugott stated that his notes do not have that taken out. Mrs. Wilson stated that she and Mr. Butler both agreed that they should keep Table 7. Mrs. Wilson stated that this table has been very helpful and it addresses aging population in Woodford County. Chairman Traugott questioned if they can combine Table 7 & 8? One is real numbers and one is percentages. Mrs. Wilson agreed they could be combined.

Mrs. Wilson stated that she questioned if they should delete Figure 27? It is just another way of showing the age of population and gender. Mrs. Perry did not believe they need it.

Mrs. Wilson stated that on Page #48 that data cannot be updated until they get the new Census data. Mrs. Perry stated that she believes that any new data that they can get, they need to do so and if Mr. Price quotes them a reasonable fee to update the data they should let him do that. Chairman Traugott questioned if Mrs. Wilson has any idea what he charged ten years ago? Mrs. Wilson stated that he was a part of that whole team so we did not compensate him specifically. Chairman Traugott stated that some things, such as the commuting patterns cannot be updated because that information will not be available until a year from now. Mrs. Wilson stated that Mr. Butler made the comment that if there is no information available, then they should document that as well.

Mr. Parrott stated that if you look at the first page it says "Woodford's Recent Population Growth Outpaces the State and the Nation." Mr. Parrott says it sounds as if we are growing faster than everyone around us. If you then go to Page 53 it says that Woodford County grew by approximately 16% and it was a rate higher than the state and the nation. If you then go to Page 44 and look at the chart it show Woodford County growing by 16.3%, but out of the seven counties listed only two grew slower than Woodford County. Woodford County was actually in the bottom three of the seven counties listed. The table and the summaries do not match. When you look at the Bluegrass Add table of those counties listed, we did not outgrow everyone in the State. The first line of the Chapter indicates that we outgrew the state and the nation and that is not true. When you look at the big picture, it is not true. This reveals how biased this document is. Chairman Traugott stated that if you look at the one handed out tonight, it has been taken out. Mr. Parrott stated that his point is that this document was spun in spite of what the data might be. Mr. Parrott stated that he wants this to be a factually correct document so that the data and the summary say the same thing. Chairman Traugott stated that is why he wants to take out the summary text that is before the tables.

Mrs. Wilson stated Mr. Butler felt that Table 12 on Page 51 has valuable information, but the new data might not be available yet. Mrs. Wilson stated that at the bottom of that page where it talks about people per household is important when you start talking about transportation and trip generations. If the data is available it is very important to keep it in there. Chairman Traugott agreed, but stated that he would like to see if there is updated information.

Mrs. Wilson stated that summaries of tables need to be all boiled down to reflect what is in the tables, but most of it is taken out. Mrs. Wilson stated that she updated the manufacturing tables. Chairman Traugott stated that was sad. Mrs. Wilson stated that there has been a 51% loss of jobs in the county. Chairman Traugott stated that it went from 3800 to about 1900. Mr. Parrott stated that those were decent paying jobs with health insurance and benefits. Mrs. Wilson stated that the biggest loss was Quebecor. They went from 1000 to 504. Kuhlman was lost as well. Texas Instruments was already gone in the current plan. KCTCS does have employees but it does not fall into this category.

Mr. Floyd questioned if there are other types of industry or is it just manufacturing? Mrs. Wilson stated that there are some retail trade numbers in the census, but she has not been able to get those updated numbers. Mrs. Wilson stated that agricultural and economics and done in any year that ends in a two or a seven. She thought it may be true for retail as well. Mrs. Wilson stated that she did update the agricultural somewhat. Mr. Floyd questioned if there are a total number of jobs showing increases or declines? Chairman Traugott stated that would come from the labor of statistics.

Chairman Traugott questioned if the agricultural census has employment in it? Mrs. Wilson stated that it did. She stated that the one thing that jumped out at her was the value of structures. The number of farms had not changed that much. The acres in farmland have declined slightly. The value of land and buildings has increased substantially. Mrs. Perry stated that sounds very high. Mr. Floyd questioned the pounds of tobacco produced in 2007? Mrs. Wilson stated that she will have to call them; because that was the number they showed. Mrs. Perry stated that is extremely high. Mr. Floyd questioned why 2002 is not shown? Mrs. Wilson stated that if they want to see that she can go back and get that data. Chairman Traugott felt it was better to have 2002 and drop of 1982. Mrs. Perry agreed. Mr. Floyd felt it would be consistent with the previous page at the top where 2002 is shown.

Chairman Traugott questioned if there were any big items of disagreement? Mrs. Wilson stated that the only thing is not having the data and not knowing when they can get it.

Mr. Parrott questioned on Page 69 of the original version is Table 24 will survive in this document? Mrs. Wilson stated that it will and it is slightly updated. Mr. Parrott stated that the reason he brings this up is when you look through here there is very little consistency in terms of the time frame that they use as references to come up with these percent changes. They seem to have chosen the interval that described it the way they wanted it to. For example in Table 24 it indicates that we have the greatest increase in per capita income of all the other counties. Throughout this it appears that they wanted to paint a picture of Woodford County always being first in everything. Mrs. Wilson stated that she actually took the percent change out completely and added their column showing what we are ranked. Chairman Traugott stated that he would have believed that Oldham County would have been the fastest. Mrs. Wilson stated that may be the case by now but it was not in 2008.

Chairman Traugott asked if Mrs. Perry saw any points of major contention. Mrs. Perry stated nothing other than things she has already mentioned and some of those have taken care of themselves. Chairman Traugott asked what they think of moving the schools over to the CFS Section. Mrs. Perry stated that she would agree to that. Mrs. Wilson stated that they need to decide which parts they would actually move.

Mrs. Wilson stated that on Page 86 there is discussion of agri-tourism and it mentions a farm tour called Beaver Creek Suffolk's and it is in some other county. Mrs. Wilson stated that she did add Wildside Vinery and Seldom Scene Farm.

Mrs. Wilson stated that on Page #120 under Housing Unit Forecasts Mr. Butlers' thoughts were: Pages 120-121 – Housing Units forecast; typically you take the increase in the number of people/population growth projections and divide by the average household size to determine the number of dwelling units forecast. It is important to forecast the number of acres demanded so that it can be incorporated into the land use plan map. That is accomplished by assigning a lot size average (say 1 unit per acre) and multiplying that by number of dwelling units forecast. What they have is okay but a little more complex than it probably needs to be. Rather than completely redoing the section it is probably okay to just update with changed population projections.

Mrs. Wilson stated that Chapter 6 could be just deleted entirely since it is already addressed in the Goals and Objectives.

Chairman Traugott questioned how his comments on Page 107, Future Issues were received? Mrs. Wilson questioned if they are going to summarize at the end of each element or if they are doing that here? Mr. Floyd questioned why they are offering opinions on this page? Chairman Traugott stated that at some point the word planned has got to mean future. Mr. Wolf questioned what is the problem with it? Mrs. Perry stated that it is something entirely new and Mr. Floyd is asking how they feel about it. Mr. Floyd stated that his point is that they have moaned about all the opinions in the current Comprehensive Plan, so why would they put in opinions? Chairman Traugott stated to be fair he wants to put it in one area and not be scattering opinions throughout the document. Mr. Floyd stated that he is not particularly against it, but that is something that they have talked about and Mr. Parrott pointed out earlier that he wanted this to be a factual document. Mrs. Perry stated that the facts say that they need to focus on employment opportunities and the facts say that you do need to focus on a lot of these things in the future. Mr. Wolf stated that the survey said it. Mrs. Wilson stated that her only question is should they stay here or be put in the Future Land Use Chapter? That is more evaluated subject matter. Everyone agreed that is where it should go. Mr. Floyd agreed because what they are looking at is all about data and facts, so it should be moved to the future section. Also if they keep all opinions in one section that will be the only place the public can poke at. They cannot be upset about data because it is what it is. Chairman Traugott stated that he did not give anyone a lot of time to think about them because they are his opinions. Mrs. Wilson stated that they may get more of those once they get more data.

Mr. Parrott stated that once they get the data and it is organized, then they can review and make comments. Mr. Floyd agreed and stated that should be the last thing they do.

Chairman Traugott stated that Mrs. Perry is the expert on the agricultural section and he hoped that he had not offended her in some way on that. Mrs. Perry stated that she really needs to read through the changes that were passed out to see if her issues have been squared away by what Mrs. Wilson has done. Mrs. Perry stated that she believes that all aspects of agricultural need to be focused on and not just the horse industry sector as has been the past focus. There are lots of people in this community who are trying to hash out a living on a family farm. Mr. Wolf questioned what the percentage of farmers is compared to a number of years ago? Mrs. Perry stated that she did not know, but there is some data in this that would be pretty good indicators. Mr. Wolf stated that the number of farms has got to have gone down. Mrs. Perry stated that you would be surprised that it has not. Mr. Wolf questioned even with the loss of tobacco? Mrs. Perry stated that some of the farmers are trying to diversify. It has been a nightmare for a lot of them, but they are trying. Mrs. Wilson stated that the number of farms has actually gone up. Mr. Parrott questioned what indicates what a farm is? Mr. Wolf questioned if they consider 30 acres a farm? Mrs. Wilson stated that for tax purposes it is ten acres, which is what the PVA goes by. Mr. Parrott stated that his question is, is it based on size or crops? Mrs. Wilson stated that she believes it is defined in the census data somewhere. Mr. Parrott stated that he feels it does need to be defined. Mrs. Perry stated that the Census Bureau defines a farm as any place where \$1,000.00 of agricultural products are sold.

Chairman Traugott questioned if there are a lot of instances of farms splitting? If there is a net increase in number, where does it come from? There has not been any land that he knows of converted into farmland. Mr. Wolf stated that there are a lot of 30 acres farms, but many of those are not farmed. Mrs. Perry stated that there are a lot of little wineries and people growing grapes and they might only sell \$1000 worth of product. Chairman Traugott questioned how much the farm community is geared toward agri-tourism? Chairman Traugott stated that he knows there are a couple of high profile farms that rely on that. He did not see where money could be made unless there is a big operation. Mrs. Perry agreed.

Mr. Parrott stated that he spoke to someone whose idea was that the medium size farms have consolidated into larger farms and then some of the others have divided into smaller farms that are probably not very productive. Mr. Wolf stated that many of the farms have turned into small horse farms and they are considered agricultural. Mrs. Perry stated that many of the farmers are trying to diversify because of the loss of tobacco. Mrs. Perry stated that if farming is someone's only income they have to be a big operation.

Mrs. Wilson stated that at the top of Page #53 there is a breakdown of the types of farms and crops. There are other things that are in those tables, such as aquaculture and bee keeping. There are about 30 different tables and some Woodford County does not have a listing for at all.

Chairman Traugott questioned what will happen when the buyout checks are gone? Mrs. Perry stated that even though many of the farmers are trying to diversify they are having difficulty now borrowing money. They can't borrow the money to invest in the equipment they need to complete the diversification. The outcome will remain to be seen.

Mr. Boggs stated that when the tobacco program was first going out the State really pumped diversification. Mr. Boggs stated that he had several friends who grew tobacco. At that time there was money to diversify, but a lot of people jumped into it thinking they could make a lot of money because that is what they were told by the University. The farmers borrowed money and tried to do the diversification and found out it was nothing like they were told. Now those farmers are really in limbo. A few of them will succeed, but only a few. Mrs. Perry stated that now they have to try something else. Mr. Boggs stated that is true, but what is it? There is a little money made from cattle and sheep and you

can make some money growing vegetables. The guys who continued to raise tobacco did pretty well until this year and if they don't have something to turn to they will lose the farms. The farmers are very discouraged about the future and there are not many who are advising their children to farm. Mrs. Perry stated that there will be a lot of farms this year that will go bankrupt. Mrs. Perry stated that many are looking at row cropping and hay. Mr. Wolf stated that we are not really a row cropping county.

Mr. Parrott stated that he is surprised that the dairy farmers are having a hard time as well. Mr. Parrott stated that he grew up milking cows and raising tobacco. Mr. Parrott stated that milk is widely used and in demand so it is hard to understand why it is not profitable. Mr. Boggs stated that he does not know either. Mr. Wolf stated that at one time in Kentucky there were 20,000 dairy farms. Mr. Wolf stated that the last he remembers and he has not been in contact for a long time, there were maybe 200. Mrs. Perry stated that a lot of the milk is produced in these large conglomerates with a huge capacity for dairy cows. That has forced out the little people. There are very few dairy farms around. There may be a few in Anderson County and perhaps in Marion County. Chairman Traugott stated that there is a push in Frankfort to subsidize it.

Mr. Wolf questioned if this chapter is pretty much finalized except for some updates to some figures? Mrs. Wilson stated that she has not been able to go through it with Mrs. Perry yet. Mr. Parrott has given general comments, but she did not know if he wants to be more specific. Mr. Parrott stated that his comments were that he would like her to draft a State minimum Comprehensive Plan with only what is required in KRS 100 and the elements that are necessary to comply with the Goals and Objectives. Mr. Parrott stated that he recalled that Mr. Butler told them what they need to have in a Comprehensive Plan. Mr. Parrott stated that he is encouraged that the 87 page double sided document has been reduced to a 43 page single page document. That is encouraging. If it can be cut down to half the size it was and make it more forward looking then he feels they will have accomplished something. Chairman Traugott stated that he believes they will reach that goal.

Chairman Traugott stated that the next homework assignment is Mobility. Mrs. Wilson stated that they need to back up and get Woodford Resources done. Mr. Parrott stated that they will also continue to look at what they have already reviewed some more to keep trying to improve it. Mrs. Wilson stated that Ms. Lefever has worked on some of the maps as well. Mrs. Wilson stated that for the next couple of weeks she will be focusing on Mobility and has some comments already from Chairman Traugott and Mr. Wolf. If anyone else has any comments she will try to get them all put together and get something back to the members for the March committee meeting. Mrs. Perry questioned if they are going to try and incorporate some of the Transportation Studies into this or are they going to put them aside as something else? Mrs. Wilson stated that her thoughts were to try and summarize the three studies that have been done. She does not want to lose the statistics because they are very important to have but has not really gotten into that. Chairman Traugott did not think that they need a list of projects. Mrs. Wilson stated that she got on the website and looked at the six year plan. Chairman Traugott stated that there is only one new road, which is Crossfield Drive extension.

Chairman Traugott questioned what the others think regarding Woodford Resources? Mrs. Wilson stated that she did add some information regarding floodplains. Chairman Traugott stated that he is fine with what has been done. Mr. Floyd stated that he was surprised how anti-septic tank it was when they are used in this country coast to coast. There is no way to run a pipe all the way through the county. Mr. Parrott stated that it says that the Health Department is responsible to inspect these systems. It goes on to say that the environmentalist reported that in Woodford County in 2010 there were 26 new systems installed and 17 failed systems repaired. Mr. Parrott did not think that this is relevant information to be in the document. Mr. Parrott stated that you can compare that to how many restaurants failed inspections and that does not need to be documented in the Comprehensive Plan. Mr. Floyd stated that he may or may not agree with that, but they should move on because they are going to come back and review the

review at a later date before a public hearing. Mr. Parrott stated that a few months ago he borrowed a magazine from Mrs. Wilson's office that talked about how technology is improving. Waste water treatment is a constantly revolving science and we have gotten really good at it. Mr. Parrott stated that it is amazing how good they have gotten. Chairman Traugott stated that he has no problem with taking it out. Mr. Parrott stated that some point there was some discussion about having mandatory septic inspections and pumping them. Mrs. Wilson stated that there was a time if a home was sold on septic that they had to have an existing inspection done. Mrs. Perry stated that they are not doing that anymore and it was not necessarily on new homes, it was any home. Mrs. Wilson questioned if it was a local decision? Mrs. Perry stated that she thought it was more widespread than that. Mr. Parrott stated that it was amazing that at one time a local Sierra Club member was found to have straight pipes on his property.

Chairman Traugott stated that the next issue will be Mobility. Mr. Floyd stated that he will try to review that and would like to get Mrs. Wilson's comments. Mrs. Wilson stated that they need to review Woodford Resources that was passed out tonight, review Mobility, and if there are more comments on People, Jobs, and Housing they can get those to her.

Mr. Wolf questioned if they have worked on the Land Use? Chairman Traugott stated that they are waiting on that.
